Staffing is the largest operational expense for behavioral health programs, so decisions about space and adjacencies must prioritize operational flows and efficiency opportunities. The healthcare sector is grappling with staffing shortages and inflation. Facilities struggle to fill necessary positions and maintain effective shifts. Designing behavioral health buildings to support excellent patient care while maximizing staffing efficiencies is imperative. Optimally designed spaces can enable operations to function with up to 20% fewer Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs).
